Day 1 – Virginia Beach

After getting in touch with your creativity and artsy vibes, visit the [Military Aviation Museum](#), home to one of the largest private collections of World War I and World War II era military aircraft in the world. Enjoy the heritage and machinery of these inspiring aircraft, many of which are airworthy and flown at the museum during flight demonstrations and at air shows throughout the year – they even offer rides to the public!

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Day 3 – Virginia Beach

On your third day in Virginia, enjoy a relaxing day in the sand in Virginia Beach, the world's longest pleasure beach! Be sure to take a stroll or a bike ride along Virginia Beach's famous five-kilometer boardwalk.

Fine dining options abound in this city by the sea and seafood lovers are in for a treat, as the fresh catch found in Virginia Beach offers up an unparalleled epicurean experience. Day 4 – Williamsburg & Central Virginia

Depart Virginia Beach and head west to begin your Virginia wine journey, starting with the exceptional wineries along the Colonial Wine Trail. Just over an hour from Virginia Beach, and minutes from Colonial Williamsburg, make a stop at Williamsburg Winery for a tour and wine tasting at one of Virginia's oldest wineries. Just up the road, experience award-winning wines on with calming views of the James River at Upper Shirley Vineyards.

Head two hours West on I-64 to Barboursville Vineyards for a tasting and tour at this spectacular vineyard on a 900-acre estate with breathtaking views of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Stay on the Barboursville estate at the 1804 Inn or enjoy a night at the nearby Inn at Willow Grove. For history lovers, James Madison's Montpelier is just a short drive away, offering a fascinating look inside the life of America's fourth President.

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Day 5 – Charlottesville

Head further west to the greater Charlottesville area to experience the heart of Central Virginia wine country. The picturesque Monticello Wine Trail features nearly 40 wineries offering tastings and tours; many of these wineries have onsite restaurants to enjoy a meal with sweeping mountain views. Many local wine tour companies offer seamless transportation options between wineries, providing hotel pick up for guests and even offering to pack a gourmet lunch for you to enjoy at one of the wonderful wineries! While in the Charlottesville area, be sure to visit Thomas Jefferson's Monticello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and don't forget to check out Charlottesville's Historic Downtown Mall, where you can enjoy a delicious feast al fresco away from automobile traffic.
